# Maine Operation Lifesaver Quarterly Newsletter August 2010



**Thirty-four more Maine driver education instructors** have recently received the free Operation Lifesaver DVD "Look to Live." The video, which was produced and released by Operation Lifesaver's national office a little more than one year ago, is targeted towards driver education students. The most recent video giveaway was at the Maine Driver Education Association conference earlier this year attended by Maine O/L volunteers Harvey Boatman and Norma Griffiths. Another batch of the DVDs were given away at last year's MDEA gathering. The offer for "Look to Live" DVDs for instructors is ongoing.

**Congratulations to the operators** of Maine's newest railroad. The Downeast Scenic Railroad returns trains to the rails in Ellsworth after 26 years and is delighting riders each weekend during the summer with a nine-mile round trip. During the first weekend of service, volunteers Bill Soule and Norma Griffiths were on hand to bring attention to the dangers of trespassing along the new line. Downeast Scenic Vice-President and Maine Operation Lifesaver volunteer Gary Briggs assisted and has also been given an ample supply of coloring books, cardboard engineer hats, and other safety-related giveaways to hand out to young riders.

With assistance from Lieutenant Chris Grotton of the State Police, a brief summary will appear with some of the basic details of conducting such an investigation. For example, it's been believed by some that the engineer is in control of the train, but in reality it's the conductor. Also, some investigators have asked for the driver's license of the engineer and/or conductor – something that doesn't exist.
